She was also asking for charities to support, so I wrote her a letter and on the 21st May there was a concert at St John's Church in Winchester called Musical Mayhem which raised the impressive sum of £1,300 for Friends of the Family. Unfortunately, Kate suffered a severe stroke before the concert date but the singers were determined that to go ahead, and sang superbly for Kate's sake, and for us.

Times are hard for small charities like us and as a committed volunteer, I know how important it is that we continue the work that we do, offering hope, encouragement, company and friendship to families who really need us.
